others on assignments.

#### **Reading Messages**

1. Click on Assessments on the navbar and select Discussions.


**2.** Enter a Subject or title for your message. It is best to use short, specific titles that indicate what the message is about.




**3.** Type your message in the message text block. Use the formatting menu at the top to personalize your message (bold, italicize, bullet, insert images). Click the three dots to expand the menu.



4. Attach a file by clicking the Add attachments link (1) and then click the Upload button (2).


